

Name of the skill: Mantoux test Department: Microbiology

Details of skill:


Montoux test, also known as Tuberculin skin test is a tool for screening tuberculosis and for tuberculosis diagnosis. The skill programme was attended by undergraduate students of medical college, paramedical and postgraduate dental college students. Under this activity the skill was demonstrated under three sections:

- a) Administration of Mantoux test
- b) Reading of results
- c) Interpretation of Mantoux test

The preparation steps included collecting of supplies, providing patient education, washing hands, locating and cleaning the injection site, and preparing the syringe. When preparing to administer the Mantoux tuberculin skin test, the area for administering the test should have a firm, well-lit surface, and that equipment and supplies should be ready. Supplies should include a vial of tuberculin, a single-dose disposable tuberculin syringe, a ruler with millimeter (mm) measurements, 2x2 gauze pads or cotton balls, alcohol swabs, a puncture resistant sharps disposal container, record-keeping forms for the patient and provider, and a pen. The tuberculin is administered using a single-dose disposable tuberculin syringe that has a one quarter to one-half inch, 27-gauge needle with a short bevel.

Participants were explained about the principle and method of Mantoux administration on suitable mannequins. Students were explained about the process of reading of the test. They were shown the results through charts and diagrams and also explained about the interpretation of results. The participants were given role play to demonstrate Mantoux test on each other .In addition to Mantoux test students were also emphasized on hand hygiene and biomedical waste management. The skill workshop was a great success and each participant enjoyed it a lot.

Department: BIOCHEMISTRY

Details of Skill:

The Phlebotomy session at the Skill Conclave was conducted from 2-3 PM at Hall B on 2.11.2022. The students were divided into two batches with Microbiology and Biochemistry conducting the sessions simultaneously. After half hour each the batches were swapped between the departments. Each session started with the presentation on Phlebotomy given by Dr. Juhi Aggarwal, Head of Department, and Biochemistry. The principles of phlebotomy were discussed by Dr. Eram.

The presentation introduced to the students the topic of Phlebotomy, its history and the duties of a phlebotomist. The presentation also illustrated the different types of tubes used in Phlebotomy and impressed upon the participants the importance and rationale of the order of draw to be followed while collecting a sample. The presentation illustrated the various sites for drawing blood and concluded with the common problems that may be encountered while drawing blood.

Following the presentation, the students were demonstrated the technique of phlebotomy on Mannequins by Mr. Bhishm Chaudhary, Senior Technician, Central Lab, Santosh Hospital. The different colour coded tubes were displayed and the analyte's estimated in each tube was discussed. In addition, needles of different gauges were also shown to the participants. The students were given the hands-on opportunity to identify and palpate the vein, draw the blood from the mannequin and transferring the blood to different tubes. The ideal methods of phlebotomy was discussed during the demonstration and the questions raised by the participants were addressed after the demonstration. The session concluded with a group photo of the instructors and participants. The enthusiastic participation of the students encouraged the faculty to bring about various other biochemical techniques for hands on training.





A detailed hands on skill training on trauma mannequin was imparted to all registered students on the evaluation and write up of medico legal scenarios involving mechanical injuries.


A 15 minute PowerPoint based presentation was imparted on the topic followed by a live case based demonstration on the mannequin.

The Objective of this session was to introduce students and train them in the skill of DIRECT OPHTHALMOSCOPY. The no. Of students who attended the session were 60.





TOPIC: Root Apex; A Conundrum in dentistry

Aim: To elucidate the students about the Anatomy of the root apex, the importance of cleaning & shaping the apical 3rd of the tooth

Objective: The objective of this lecture is to brief the clinical debridement of the apical third of the root canal system.

Attributes of the Lecture: Cleaning and shaping the root canal system is essential to clinical success in endodontic treatment. The apical third is the most difficult to clean and shape because of the ever-increasing complexity of the anatomy, that is the ramifications and the tortuosity. Anatomy of the apical 3rd involves structures like Anatomic apex, Radiographic apex, Major diameter, Minor diameter, Apical constriction, Accessory canals and Lateral canals. Apical third of the root canal system can cleaned and shaped and rendered free of organic substrates and debris. From here, three-dimensional compaction of gutta-percha in conjunction with sealer is easy.













Depression

A prolonged sense of sadness and loss of interest are symptoms of depression, a mood illness. Clinical depression, also known as major depressive disorder, affects how you feel, think, and behave and can cause a number of emotional and physical issues. You can find it difficult to carry out your regular daily tasks, and you might occasionally think life isn't worth living.

Depression is more than just a case of the blues, and you can't immediately "snap out" of it. Long-term treatment may be necessary for depression. But resist giving up. With medicine, counselling, or both, the majority of depressed persons get improved symptoms.

Although you might only experience depression once in your lifetime, most people experience many bouts. During these episodes, symptoms can include any of the following and may last for the majority of the day:

Sadness, tears, emptiness, or a sense of futility, Irrational behaviour, irritation, or frustration, especially about trivial issues, Loss of enjoyment or interest in the majority of everyday activities, including sex, hobbies, and sports, Sleep disorders, such as insomnia or excessive sleeping Due to fatigue and a lack of energy, even simple tasks need more effort. Weight loss and decreased appetite, or weight gain and increased desires for food a feeling of unease, anxiety, or worry sluggish speech, posture, or other body movements, feelings of guilt or worthlessness, a fixation on mistakes made in the past, or self-blame, Problems with memory, concentration, decision-making, and thought

Substance use disorder

Drug addiction, also known as substance use disorder, is an illness that affects a person's brain and behaviour and causes them to lose control over whether or not they take drugs or medications, whether they are legal or not. Alcohol, marijuana, and nicotine are examples of substances that are regarded as drugs. If you are hooked, you might use the drug even when it is harmful.

Drug abuse can begin with the occasional recreational drug usage that some people engage in in social settings before developing a drug addiction. Others experience drug addiction when they take prescribed medications or get them from those who have prescriptions, especially when it comes to opioids.

Each substance has a different level of addiction danger and speed of addiction development. The risk and speed of addiction are higher with some medicines than others, such as opioid painkillers. As time goes on, you might require higher drug doses to feel high. You might eventually require the medicine just to feel decent. You could find that it gets harder to abstain as your drug use rises. When you try to stop using drugs, you could experience severe cravings and physical sickness. We refer to this as withdrawal symptoms.

Childhood disorders

Parents may find it challenging to recognise a child's mental condition. Many kids who could benefit from treatment don't receive it as a result. Recognize the symptoms of childhood mental illness and learn how to support your child.

The whole state of your thinking, emotion control, and behaviour is referred to as your mental health. Patterns or changes in thought, mood, or behaviour that cause distress or impair a person's capacity to function are referred to as mental illnesses or mental health disorders.

Children's mental health disorders are often characterised as delays or disturbances in the development of thinking, acting, socialising, or emotion management in accordance with age. Children who have these issues find it difficult to operate normally at home, at school, or in other social settings.

Because typical childhood development is a changing process, it might be challenging to comprehend mental health concerns in children. Additionally, a child's age may affect the symptoms of a condition, and children may not be able to articulate their feelings or the reasons behind their actions.

Parents may be discouraged from getting treatment for a kid who has a suspected mental disorder for a variety of reasons. Parents may be worried about the stigma attached to mental illness, the usage of pharmaceuticals, the cost of treatment, or the logistical difficulties involved.

Emotional intelligence

The capacity to recognise, use, and regulate your own emotions in order to reduce stress, communicate clearly, sympathise with others, overcome obstacles, and diffuse conflict is known as emotional intelligence (EQ). You can develop stronger relationships, perform well at work and school, and reach your professional and personal objectives with the aid of emotional intelligence. Additionally, it can assist you in establishing a connection with your emotions, putting your intentions into practise, and choosing what is most important to you.

Emotional intelligence characterised as:

Self-management - You have the capacity to restrain impulsive thoughts, feelings, and actions, to regulate your emotions in healthy ways, to take the initiative, to keep your word, and to adjust to changing circumstances.

Self-awareness — You are aware of your feelings and how they influence your actions and thinking. You are confident in yourself and are aware of your talents and flaws.

You are socially aware and empathic. You are able to discern emotional indicators, comprehend the needs and worries of others, feel at ease in social situations, and comprehend the power relationships in a team or organisation.

Relationship management: You have the ability to create and sustain positive relationships, communicate effectively, motivate and influence people, collaborate effectively with others, and handle conflict.

COVID - 19 psychological manifestations and treatment

In order to spread to cells other than the epithelial cells of the respiratory tract, the coronavirus may be able to evade the immune response. Certain coronaviruses have been found to have the ability to cause neuro-invasive diseases, including Middle East respiratory syndrome (MERS) and severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS) (MERS). Many survivors may be at risk of developing a variety of neuropsychiatric sequelae based on earlier outbreaks, such as SARS and MERS, and recent reports of neuropsychiatric problems following COVID-19. Growing data suggests that COVID-19 survivors may have issues with their mental health. According to this review, post-COVID-19 infection is linked to psychological symptoms such despair, anxiety, and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Although the precise aetiology of these psychiatric aftereffects has not yet been identified, it appears to entail biological, psychological, and environmental aspects.


Montoux test, also known as Tuberculin skin test is a tool for screening tuberculosis and for tuberculosis diagnosis. The skill programme was attended by undergraduate students of medical college ,paramedical and postgraduate dental college students. Under this activity the skill was demonstrated under three sections:


- a)Administration of Mantoux test
- b)Reading of results
- c)Interpretation of Mantoux test

The preparation steps included collecting of supplies, providing patient education, washing hands, locating and cleaning the injection site, and preparing the syringe. When preparing to administer the Mantoux tuberculin skin test, the area for administering the test should have a firm, well-lit surface, and that equipment and supplies should be ready. Supplies should include a vial of tuberculin, a single-dose disposable tuberculin syringe, a ruler with millimeter (mm) measurements, 2x2 gauze pads or cottonballs, alcohol swabs, a puncture resistant sharps disposal container, record-keeping forms for the patient and provider, and a pen. The tuberculin is administered using a single-dose disposable tuberculin syringe that has a one quarter to one-half inch, 27-gauge needle with a short bevel.

Participants were explained about the principle and method of Mantoux administration on suitable manequins. Students were explained about the process of reading of the test. They were shown the results through charts and diagrams and also explained about the interpretation of results. The participants were given role play to demonstrate Mantoux test on each other .In addition to Mantoux test students were also emphasized on hand hygiene and biomedical waste management. The skill workshop was a great success and each participant enjoyed it a lot.

Details of Skill:

The Phlebotomy session at the Skill Conclave was conducted from 2-3 PM at Hall B on 2.11.2022. The students were divided into two batches with Microbiology and Biochemistry conducting the sessions simultaneously. After half hour each the batches were swapped between the departments. Each session started with the presentation on Phlebotomy given by Dr. Juhi Aggarwal, Head of Department, Biochemistry. The principles of phlebotomy were discussed by Dr. Eram.

The presentation introduced to the students the topic of Phlebotomy, its history and the duties of a phlebotomist. The presentation also illustrated the different types of tubes used in Phlebotomy and impressed upon the participants the importance and rationale of the order of draw to be followed while collecting a sample. The presentation illustrated the various sites for drawing blood and concluded with the common problems that may be encountered while drawing blood.

Following the presentation, the students were demonstrated the technique of phlebotomy on Mannequins by Mr. Bhishm Chaudhary, Senior Technician, Central Lab, Santosh Hospital. The different colour coded tubes were displayed and the analyte's estimated in each tube was discussed. In addition, needles of different gauges were also shown to the participants. The students were given the hands-on opportunity to identify and palpate the vein, draw the blood from the mannequin and transferring the blood to different tubes. The ideal methods of phlebotomy was discussed during the demonstration and the questions raised by the participants were addressed after the demonstration. The session concluded with a group photo of the instructors and participants. The enthusiastic participation of the students encouraged the faculty to bring about various other biochemical techniques for hands on training.


















Event report

- Do you think online classes implemented the impact of curriculum and did it leave any anxiety or stress?



Name of the Skill: PHLEBOTOMY Department: BIOCHEMISTRY

Faculty Coordinators: Dr. JUHI AGGARWAL and Dr. SOJIT TOMO

Details of Skill:

The Phlebotomy session at the Skill Conclave was conducted from 2-3 PM at Hall B. The students were divided into two batches with Microbiology and Biochemistry conducting the sessions simultaneously. After half hour each the batches were swapped between the departments. Each session started with the presentation on Phlebotomy given by Dr. Juhi Aggarwal, Head of Department, Biochemistry. The principles of phlebotomy were discussed by Dr. Sojit Tomo.

The presentation introduced to the students the topic of Phlebotomy, its history and the duties of a phlebotomist. The presentation also illustrated the different types of tubes used in Phlebotomy and impressed upon the participants the importance and rationale of the order of draw to be followed while collecting a sample. The presentation illustrated the various sites for drawing blood and concluded with the common problems that may be encountered while drawing blood.

Following the presentation, the students were demonstrated the technique of phlebotomy on Mannequins by Mr.Manoj Tyagi, Senior Technical supervisor, Central Lab, Santosh Hospital. The different colour coded tubes were displayed and the analytes estimated in each tube was discussed. In addition, needles of different gauges were also shown to the participants. The students were given the hands-on opportunity to identify and palpate the vein, draw the blood from the mannequin and transferring the blood to different tubes. The ideal methods of phlebotomy were discussed during the demonstration and the questions raised by the participants were addressed after the demonstration. The session concluded with a group photo of the instructors and participants. The enthusiastic participation of the students encouraged the faculty to bring about various other biochemical techniques for hands on training.

Details of skill:

Workshop conducted in skillcon 2021 on 25th November 2021. Montoux test, also known as Tuberculin skin test is a tool for screening tuberculosis and for tuberculosis diagnosis. The skill programme was attended by undergraduate students of medical college, paramedical and postgraduate dental college students. Under this activity the skill was imparted under three sections:

a)Administration of Mantoux test

b)Reading of results

c) Interpretation of Mantoux test

The preparation steps included collecting of supplies, providing patient education, washing hands, locating and cleaning the injection site, and preparing the syringe. When preparing to administer the Mantoux tuberculin skin test, the area for administering the test should have a firm, well-lit surface, and that equipment and supplies should be ready. Supplies should include a vial of tuberculin, a single-dose disposable tuberculin syringe, a ruler with millimeter (mm) measurements, 2x2 gauze pads or cottonballs, alcohol swabs, a puncture resistant sharps disposal container, record-keeping forms for the patient and provider, and a pen. The tuberculin is administered using a single-dose disposable tuberculin syringe that has a one quarter to one-half inch, 27-gauge needle with a short bevel.

Participants were explained about the principle and method of Mantoux administration on suitable mannequins. Students were explained about the process of reading of the test. They were shown the results through charts and diagrams and also explained about the interpretation of results. The participants were given role play to demonstrate Mantoux test on each other .In addition to Mantoux test students were also emphasized on hand hygiene and biomedical waste management. The skill workshop was a great success and each participant enjoyed it a lot.

Hands on training were given on how to appreciate retina, its glow & all its structures as well as what all pathologies they could detect while performing this step & to correlate the retinal pathologies with systemic diseases.

- Each participant was able to see optic nerve head, fovea & surrounding blood vessel.


<u>Virtual Orientation Workshop in International Healthcare - 29.11.2020</u>





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
