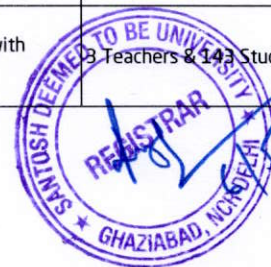

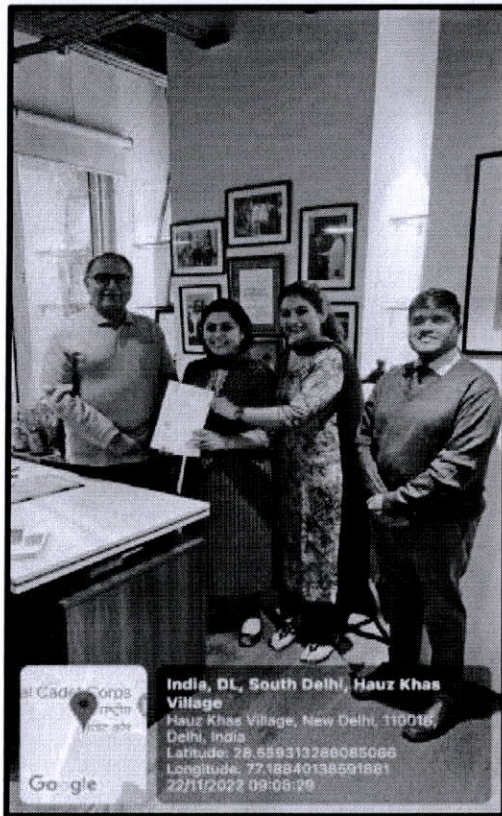
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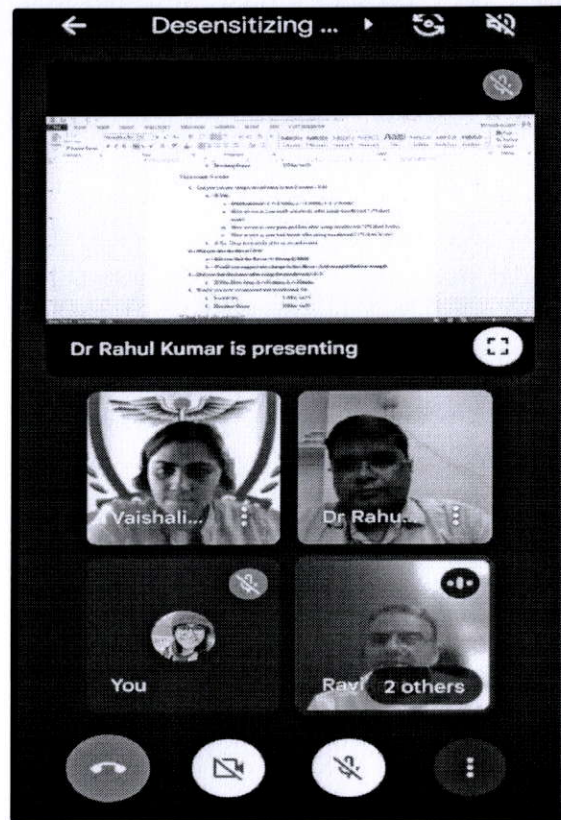
ACTIVITIES UNDER MOU

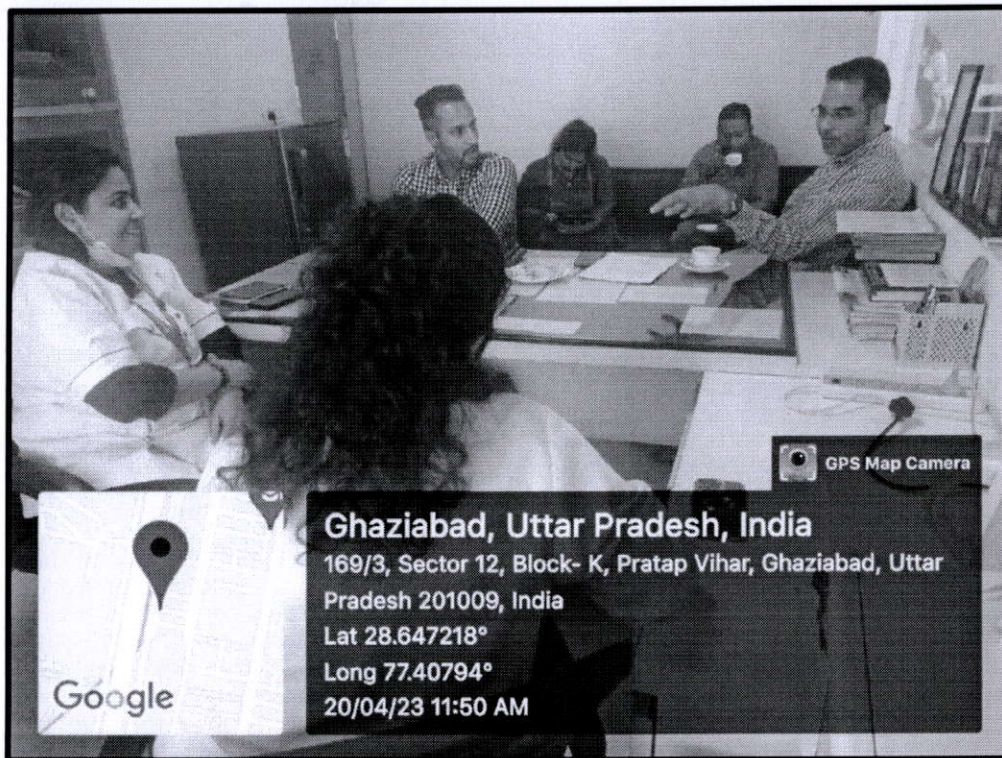

Title: - NAFLD (FATTY LIVER), Diabetes and Metabolic Disease Camp

Camp Date/ Time: 11 Aug 2023, 9.30 AM TO 01.30 PM

Venue: General Medicine OPD area

Diabetes Mellitus (DM) is a metabolic disease defined by hyperglycemia due to defects in insulin secretion, insulin action, or both. The predominance of diabetes has increased worldwide in both genders equally. There is a dramatic increase in the ubiquity of diabetes owing to modernization and urbanization that has brought about a substantial burden on health care services.

Metabolic syndrome (Met S) is defined as a cluster of cardiovascular risk factors which include raised fasting plasma glucose, central obesity, hypertension, raised triglycerides, and reduced High-Density Lipoprotein (HDL) cholesterol. Met S is known to be caused by insulin resistance or insulin resistance-linked obesity also known as syndrome X or insulin resistance syndrome; it has been recognized since the 1980s. The guidelines for the diagnosis of metabolic syndrome have been given by different organizations such as World Health Organization (WHO), International Diabetic Federation (IDF), and National Cholesterol Education Program Adult Treatment Panel III (NCEP ATP III) imparted a new working definition of the metabolic syndrome and thus, it is easily applicable and provides strong clinical evidence. DM is associated with a three to fivefold increased risk for the development of Metabolic Syndrome (Met S) which has now reached high proportions in many countries. The worldwide prevalence of Met S is between 7.9–43% in males and 7–56% in females.

The Met S is influenced by several factors, some of which can accelerate the disease progression to various complications that aggravate the morbidity. Studies on the prevalence of Met S among type II DM patients are still lacking in India especially in North India. There is a high need for identifying the risk factors and preventing the Met S in diabetic patients. Hence, identification of Met S and its factors helps to show maximum compliance to therapeutic regimen and healthy lifestyle. Moreover, the increase in public awareness and health education programs help in preventing the onset of more comorbidity that compromises the health and improvement of the quality of life of the population. The main aim of the study was to identify the occurrence of Met S and to evaluate component of Met S by using IDF and NCEP ATP III criteria.

Introduction:

Department of General Medicine, Santosh Medical College and Hospital in collaboration with Delhi Diabetic forum organized and conducted a **NAFLD (FATTY LIVER), Diabetes and Metabolic Disease Camp** on **11 Aug 2023** to raise awareness about diabetes, metabolic diseases and its complication includes heart disease, atrial fibrillation, stroke, and thromboembolic diseases, and NAFLD in the

Department of general Medicine, Santosh Hospital Ghaziabad.

The aim of the camp was to detect these diseases early and provide necessary medical attention to prevent complications. The camp was attended by around 100 people, and several medical professionals were present to conduct the tests.

The attendees were given a general health check-up, and their medical history was recorded. Blood samples were taken for spot glucose, HbA1C, lipid level testing and liver function testing, complete blood count. Blood pressure and body mass index (BMI), waist circumference, were also measured. Liver stiffness measured by FIBROSCAN [transient elastography] device that is noninvasive device used to measure liver scarring or fibrosis.

Results: Out of the 80 attendees, 25 % had high blood pressure, and 35 % were overweight or obese with fibrosis score 2 i.e. moderate liver scarring. The majority of attendees were found to have high glucose and lipid levels, indicating a high risk of diabetes and dyslipidemia. Around 15 % of the attendees showed transaminitis with 25 % insulin resistance.

Recommendations: Those who were diagnosed with diabetes, NAFLD OR Metabolic disease and dyslipidemia, and were provided with medical consultation and treatment options. The attendees who were at high risk were advised to adopt a healthy lifestyle, including a balanced diet and regular physical activity, to prevent the onset of these diseases.

Conclusion: The prevalence of Met S is higher in type II DM patients. Older age, female gender, high BMI/obesity, higher blood pressure, low HDL level, and waist circumference significantly contributed to an increased risk of metabolic syndrome among the diabetic population. Routine screening for metabolic components may be benefit for appropriate interventions and help in preventing premature morbidity and mortality. Many factors associated with metabolic syndrome are modifiable so, early intervention, particularly with a lifestyle change, would delay the onset of advanced forms of Met S and a high-risk status. Regular physical activity, lifetime abstinence of tobacco, avoidance in the consumption of trans fats (fried food), and reduced intake of saturated fats together with an increased intake of fruits and vegetables form the foundation of lifestyle changes. Adopting a healthy lifestyle beginning in childhood can reduce the incidence of complications associated with metabolic syndrome among patients with Diabetic Mellitus. Apart from Screening and treating our camp was also focused on making the patient aware of their illness and how prompt lifestyle modifications and regular testing and medications can help control the entities.

On 31st October, 2023, members of the medical community convened on the Medisage platform in a virtual setting to observe a case presentation conducted by Dr. Prasanth Gutti, a second-year postgraduate student at Santosh Hospital in Ghaziabad.

Dr. Ashok Kumar, the Head of the Department of Medicine at SMCH Ghaziabad, extends a warm greeting to all attendees and proceeds to provide a concise overview of the case at hand. He introduces the panel member Dr. Amba Prasad Dubey, Associate Professor SMCH, Ghaziabad and the lecturer, Dr. Prasanth. The virtual session, centered upon a particularly intriguing case of pyrexia with Hepatosplenomegaly, provided attendees with a substantial amount of knowledge and valuable insights. The lecture was initiated by Dr. Prasanth, who provided a thorough examination of pyrexia, highlighting its diagnostic complexities and medical importance. The individual adeptly expressed the intricacy involved in assessing pyrexia, thoroughly exploring the wide range of infectious and non-infectious factors that can contribute to an increased body temperature. He also explains in detail how to approach a case of Hepatosplenomegaly.

The central focus of the presentation revolved around a compelling case study, which provided a comprehensive analysis of a patient who had perplexed the medical community due to an enduring fever of uncertain etiology and Hepatosplenomegaly. Dr. Prasanth skillfully guided the audience through the diagnostic process, elucidating the careful and systematic approach employed to ascertain the root cause. The attendees were fully engaged as he elaborated on the diagnostic examinations, many potential diagnoses, and the eventual outcome of the case.

The seminar culminated with an engaging question and answer session, providing attendees with the opportunity to directly engage with Dr. Prasanth. During this session, Dr. Prasanth graciously provided his clinical expertise and practical strategies for effectively managing complex instances of pyrexia with Hepatosplenomegaly. During an era characterized by increased accessibility to medical knowledge, Dr. Prasanth Gutti's lecture served as a poignant reminder of the significance of clinical acumen and unwavering determination when confronted with perplexing diagnostic challenges. The persuasive case study presented by the individual had a lasting impression on the audience, reinforcing the significance of ongoing education and collaboration among medical professionals.

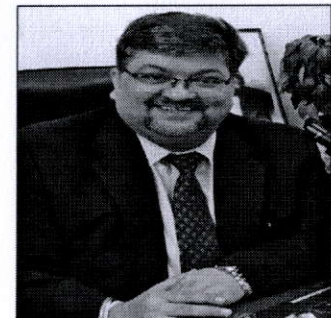






Guest Editorial

Importance of ethics in oral pathology



I feel extreme pleasure to share with you all that our association Indian Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathologists and International Chair in Bioethics (Formerly UNESCO Chair in Bioethics University of Haifa) have recently signed an Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and jointly commits to promoting the cause of Bioethics as well as advocacy and awareness towards the principles of Bioethics among the honourable members of our association.

The term ethics refers to moral philosophy or a set of moral principles that regulate what is right, good, virtuous, true, and just, as defined by a culture or society.^[1] Health care professionals always have the ethical responsibility to act in the best interest of the patient.

In addition to the standard moral and practice values published by Accredited Social Health Activist and other professional organizations, there are additional values that are relevant to medical ethics in both clinical care and research.^[2,3] These include the following:

- Autonomy
- Beneficence
- Nonmaleficence
- Justice
- Dignity
- Truthfulness and Honesty.

AUTONOMY

The value of autonomy refers to the patient's (or the guardian's) right to be actively involved in making decisions about his or her own medical care. As oral pathologist, we describe the importance of various procedures as well as their drawbacks and give the decision-making power to the patients to choose their preferred treatment plan.

BENEFICENCE

It is a core value of health care because it involves actions that result in the well-being of others. The health care professional has the ethical responsibility to act in the best interest of the patient at all times. As oral pathologists, we have a responsibility to ourselves for the best outcome for the patient of society at large.

NON-MALEFICENCE

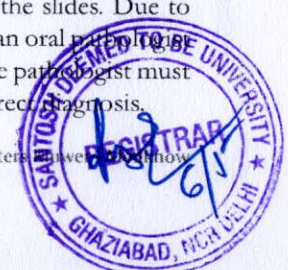
The word maleficence means doing harm or evil. Therefore, it is best described by the phrase "first do no harm.". The health care practitioner must be reasonably sure that the patient will get benefit from the treatment prior to recommending the treatment. In histopathology laboratories nowadays, the lab technician uses a "sink test" for a small sample.

Sink testing is a form of laboratory diagnostics healthcare fraud where clinical specimens are discarded, via a sink drain and fabricated results are reported, without the clinical specimen actually being tested.^[4] Giving a wrong report is doing harm to the patient health as the treatment of the patient will depend upon the reports of tests.

JUSTICE

It is the right of all individuals to have equal and fair access to health care resources. In a society where not all citizens have access to health care insurance, this value is often an ethical challenge for health care organisations and providers.

In oral pathology, there are many instances during the tissue processing that can lead to artifacts in the slides. Due to this, sometimes it might be difficult for an oral pathologist to give an exact diagnosis. Therefore, the pathologist must do justice to the patient by giving a correct diagnosis.



DIGNITY

The value of dignity relates to the basic human rights of the patient and family, which should be observed while they are being served in a health care setup. These may include:

- The right to be treated with respect and dignity.
- The right to ask questions.
- The right to be involved in the treatment decision-making and to refuse treatment if desired.
- The right to access the medical record.
- The right to privacy and confidentiality.

TRUTHFULNESS AND HONESTY

They are two important pillars between the health care provider and the patient. A truly “informed” consent can only be given if the patient/family has a thorough understanding of the facts, implications and future consequences of proposed treatment. As oral pathologist, we should give detailed information about the reports given to the patients so that the patient fully understands and can make a further treatment decision for themselves.

BIOETHICS

According to UNESCO Bioethics can be defined as the systematic, pluralistic and interdisciplinary study involving the theoretical and practical moral issues raised by the life sciences and humanity's relationship with the biosphere.^[4] Bioethics is the most suitable and ethical method of dealing with the condition that arises in the field of medicine, more so in current times with the beginning of new technology.

ETHICS IN ORAL PATHOLOGY

Ethical values should be taught to every dental student. As a professional we should:

1. Be aware of the responsibilities that we accept when entering the dental profession.
2. Meet the standards of competence, care and conduct while rendering service.
3. Above all the care of patients should be our first concern.
4. Ethics in research- Clinical trials.

Hence ethics forms an important dimension of a profession. The code of ethics prescribed by regulatory bodies as well as professional associations act as a guiding light in distinguishing between right and wrong, observing one's duties and maintaining good interpersonal relationships.

ETHICS FOR ORAL MAXILLOFACIAL PATHOLOGIST

The goal of the study is to bring some light on the ethics that are to be followed or faced by maxillofacial pathologists in their practice –

HISTORY

The first step is a collection of information by way of thorough history taking, which is often neglected. It is not only mandatory, but a professional responsibility to be aware of the patient's medical history of diseases that may affect the patient's dental treatment. It is also equally important to take medication histories, not only to prevent prescription errors and consequent risks to patients but also to detect drug-related clinical and/or pathological changes.

THE PATIENT-MAXILLOFACIAL PATHOLOGIST RELATIONSHIP

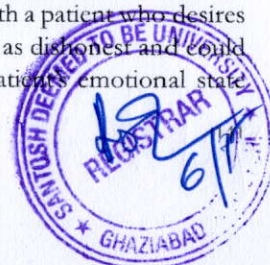
The relationship is unique as this branch is a bridge between dentistry and medicine. Most patient care responsibilities undertaken by a pathologist do not involve much face-to-face interaction. These responsibilities include interpreting a biopsy specimen, surgical resection, or cytology fluid sample; reviewing a peripheral blood smear or cytology, maintaining chemistry, microbiology, haematology, or molecular laboratory.

These responsibilities can involve sensitive information collected from patients' specimens therefore oral pathologists are obligated to protect patient's privacy, ensure that a specimen remains uniquely identified with a specific patient and treat patients' specimens, parts, and bodies with respect.^[6]

DISCLOSING THE DIAGNOSIS TO THE PATIENT AND PHYSICIAN

In many cases, oral pathologists are physically detached from the patients whose care they influence, but physical separation does not abstain the pathologists to perform their duty to patients whose cells appear on a slide. In this regard, the obligation and responsibility of a pathologist are very crucial when it comes to disclosing the diagnosis of the patient.

Obligation to disclose to the patient. Principles of honesty and good faith apply to all physicians, so evading an obligation to share a preliminary diagnosis with a patient who desires that information can be perceived as dishonest and could have deleterious effects on the patient's emotional state.



and trust in the health care system. Direct communication between the pathologist and his or her clinical colleagues is a central principle of professionalism, and the same honesty and openness apply to the patient-pathologist relationship.

Obligation to disclose to the patient's referring physician. It is true in today's practice of medicine; patient care is team-based. Therefore, it is the primary duty of the maxillofacial pathologist to discuss and correlate the case with the referring physician as they have direct contact with the patient and know more about their clinical history.^[7]

DESIGNING AND IMPLEMENTING A COMMUNICATION CURRICULUM

Traditionally, there has been little attention to teamwork and communication skills in pathology and laboratory training. The lack of focus on developing effective communication skills represents a major gap in the education of pathologists, as a lack of standardised expectations for conversations and explicit communication training could contribute to errors in information transfers between pathologists and other clinicians.

COMMISSIONS PRACTICE

Commissions for referrals (collectively called "cuts" or "kickbacks") are a longstanding and widespread practice in Indian healthcare. They are now so much a part of mainstream healthcare, that most doctors have accepted them as a natural accompaniment to patient referrals. Periodic media exposure to this practice brings the issue transiently into public awareness, but it continues regardless. There is no question that commissions in healthcare, not only erode trust but also have other serious consequences. As well as leading to unnecessary tests and procedures, the money that exchanges hands is factored into patients' bills. This adds to the already high costs that citizens have to bear in India's growing private sector, which now dominates healthcare. Also, if referrals are based on commissions, the patient will likely be referred to the highest paying doctor and not to the most suitable one. Therefore, giving and receiving cuts is not just a matter of ethics, but it also increases the costs of care and decreases its quality.

DISCLOSING ERRORS

When errors occur in pathology and laboratory medicine, they can generate profound diagnostic confusion. These errors can take a variety of forms in different subspecialties. Errors in laboratory medicine and clinical pathology can occur at any point from specimen retrieval through specimen analysis; they are classified broadly as pre-analytic

Types Of Potentially Identifying Information	Recommendations
Date	Avoid saying, "today I saw a case of rare entity X" or "yesterday I diagnosed entity Y." Never use dates. Be intentionally vague.
Unusual or newsworthy circumstances	Avoid information disclosure that could allow direct association with a recent crime or accident. Consider delay in posting cases that are highly unusual.
Identifying images	Avoid posting full facial images, unique tattoos, or other identifying features without explicit patient permission.
Age	Approximate ages are a good idea for all posts even though not legally required. Precise age should be avoided.

phase, analytic phase and post-analytic phase errors. Preanalytical phase errors take place before the specimen arrives in the pathology lab and comprise the majority of laboratory errors, analytic phase errors take place during the laboratory processing and analysis of the specimen, and post-analytic phase errors take place during the reporting of the lab results to clinicians and clinicians' interpretation of those results. Transparency in their regard is desirable.

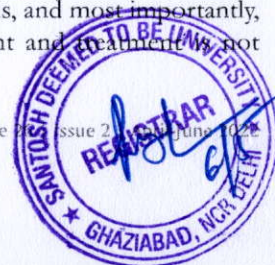
IMAGE-SHARING: A PRIVACY PROTECTIONS

Although the accessibility of social media has raised questions about whether more strict privacy standards should be implemented and enforced, it is easy to forget that journal-based reports are also publicly available, even if access is fee- or library-based.

Therefore, some guidelines have been issued by American Medical Association (AMA) protecting patient privacy for clinicians using social media.^[8]

DISCLAIMER - TO CORRELATE CLINICALLY??

In the pathological report, we often see the sentence: Clinical correlation is recommended. "This simply means that mere examination of the pathologic material (like histology, immunohistochemistry results, etc) alone may not suffice, but must be correlated with the patient's clinical findings, chief complaint and presentation, relevant physical examination and other relevant additional tests such as biochemistry results, and imaging studies (like CT scan, MRI, etc.) under the context of a "Multidisciplinary Team (MDT)" approach in the evaluation and management of patients. In this perspective, a better understanding of the disease, its definitive diagnosis, and most importantly, proper and correct management and treatment, not compromised is recommended.



CONCLUSION

Bioethics plays a significant role in medical and dental practice. Dental professionals are one of the healing professions, therefore, they have an obligation to society for adhering to high ethical standards and conduct. The code of ethics teaches all clinicians to put their patients first, to involve the patient in treatment decisions, to consider the patient's expectations during treatment planning, to respecting their decision regarding the treatment and to maintain the confidentiality of the patient. Without a solid ethical foundation, one cannot be a true professional so ethics are critical to being a professional.

Also, there are no such guidelines or protocols formed for the oral pathologist to be followed given by the Indian Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathologists¹ (IAOMP) or the Indian Dental Association (IDA). There is a need for some protocols, ethics and rules to be formed by these organisations to create more discipline amongst the maxillofacial pathologist so that they could deliver the best to their patients. As well as bioethical values, such as human rights, dignity, respect for autonomy and vulnerability must be discussed and incorporated into clinical practice as well as in academic institutions. The declining index of patients' view of ethical standards in the health care system is demeaning. It is high time we take protective steps and put our house in order to ensure that ethical practice must be strictly pursued.

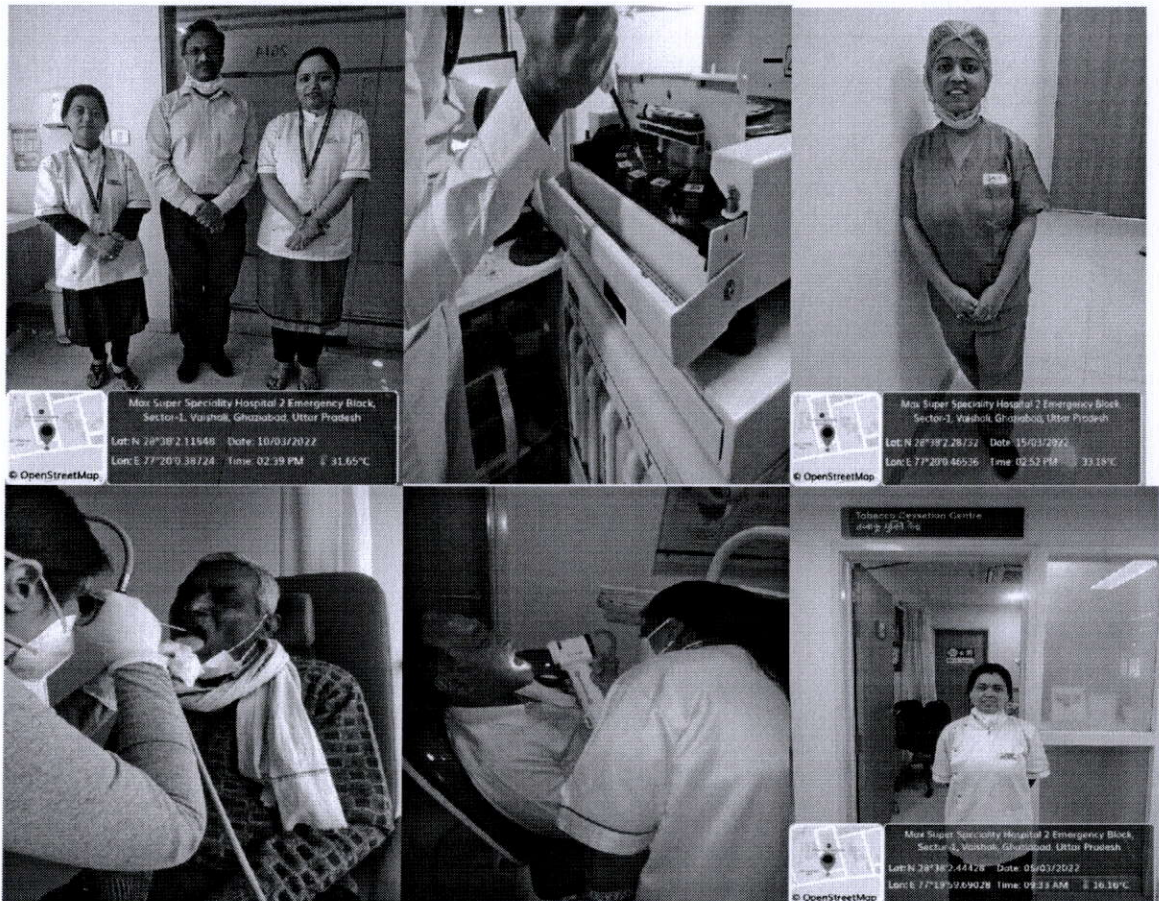
Report of Peripheral posting at MAX Institute of Cancer Care , VAISHALI

Summary of Posting in Surgical Oncology as per the MoU between Santosh Deemed to be University and Department of Surgical Oncology, Max Superspeciality Hospital, Vaishali.

I have joined observership at Department of Histopathology & Surgical Oncology, MAX Institute of Cancer Care, Vaishali, under guidance of Dr. Pawan Gupta, The Academic Dean & Director, Head and Neck. I got an opportunity to see several pathologies related to head & neck region, such as cancer of buccal mucosa, tongue, soft palate, how to assess the clinical Depth of Invasion (DOI) of the lesion and clinical examination of the patients also examining the lymph node. I got an opportunity to see how to differentiate between different types of ulcer. I got to know about Histological assessment of DOI and to saw different histological slides of few rare cases eg. Abstract

Patient care with sound knowledge of bioethical obligation towards patient care is essential in dealing with situations that arise in the field of medicine. This is more so in COVID-19 times. Beneficence demands that health care providers develop and maintain skills and knowledge, continually update training, consider individual circumstances of all patients, and strive for patients' well-being and benefit. Problems arising from unethical approach have now reached global proportions and this has prompted global institutions to work on this and create awareness amongst health care workers toward ethical approach. A pleasing appearance in today's world has become a necessity, the smile being a prime asset to an individual's appearance. Feeling attractive is directly related to elevated self-esteem. However, the objectives of cosmetic dentistry need to be met with unscrupulous treatment, keeping in mind dental ethics and adhering to the principles.

Consider a 20-year-old patient who reports to your clinic with the chief complaint of forwardly placed teeth and to seek aesthetic treatment. Patient is aware that he/she may be treated to a result he/she desires by orthodontic or by cosmetic dentistry procedures. What are the factors that will help the patient make this choice? Is it "beneficence or bucks?" We will be faced with such bioethical dilemmas frequently.

I am often asked the question "What is bioethics?" Initially, I used to tell people the definition of bioethics. However, with time I realized that a simple communication would be more appropriate. Bioethics is the most appropriate and moral way of dealing with the situation that arises in the field of medicine, more so in contemporary times in the pandemic. Bioethics includes all issues from plagiarism to patient management.

Problems arising from unethical approach have now reached global proportions and this has prompted global institutions to work on this and create awareness amongst health care workers toward ethical approach. The UNESCO Chair in bioethics, Haifa, has taken lead in this and subsequently the Indian National Bioethics Program was established in India. It is with great pride I share that the Indian Orthodontic Society is the first Indian specialty to have a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with UNESCO Chair in bioethics, Haifa and is determined to further the cause of bioethics amongst its members.

Next question is "Why should I know about bioethics?" "The eyes cannot see what the mind does not know." In contemporary dentistry with increasing disparity between

patients and doctors and rise in the number of legal cases, the knowledge of contemporary bioethics is not only desirable but also mandatory.

With all equal, a patient would definitely choose the doctor more ethical in his approach.

How do I learn more on bioethics?

Bioethics has now been introduced in the curriculum by the regulatory bodies. Students and those who are in practice need to update in the subject by attending seminars, workshops, and lectures organized by recognized institutions in this subject. UNESCO Chair in bioethics, Haifa, holds many accreditation programs to further the cause.

Can I get accreditation in bioethics?

UNESCO Chair in bioethics, Haifa conducts several programs to create awareness amongst dentists. Dr Russell D'Souza is the Asia Pacific Head and Dr Mary Mathew, the Indian Head. Dr Rajiv Ahluwalia is the Head of the National Indian Dental Bioethics Program, UNESCO Chair Bioethics, Haifa with its National nodal center at Santosh Dental College, Ghaziabad [NCRI]. Many lectures and workshops are conducted under this umbrella. Now Indian Orthodontic Society has tied up with UNESCO Chair in bioethics, Haifa, with a MOU showing its commitment toward this cause.

What Should A Good Orthodontist Do?

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ABSTRACT

The word "moral" is defined as relating to the principles of right and wrong in behavior and "ethics" is defined as a system of moral values or the principles of conduct governing an individual or a group and deals with the values relating to human conduct, with respect to the right and wrong of certain actions and to the goodness and badness of the motives and ends of such actions. An orthodontist must follow basic bioethical principles such as benevolence, autonomy, causing no harm, and justice in order to instill the patient-doctor trust and to have healthy clinical practice. It should be emphasized that the use of these principles is of extreme importance in facing the ethical issues common to clinical practice.

INTRODUCTION

Ethics are the moral principles or virtues that govern the character and conduct of an individual or a group, as a branch of both philosophy and theology, is the systematic study of what is right and good with respect to the character and conduct.^[1]

According to UNESCO Bioethics can be defined as the systematic, pluralistic and interdisciplinary study involving the theoretical and practical moral issues raised by the life sciences and humanity's relationship with the biosphere.^[2]

Several aspects that directly influence a population's access to public dental services and actions that contribute to inequities in oral health are questions of ethical content and should be examined from ethical standpoints, especially protection and intervention bioethics.^[2]

An orthodontist must follow basic bioethical principles such as beneficence, autonomy, non-maleficence and justice to instill the patient-doctor trust and to have healthy clinical practice. It should be emphasized that the use of these principles is of extreme importance in facing the ethical issues common to clinical practice.

Patient autonomy ("self-governance")

It expresses the concept that professionals have a duty to treat the patient according to the patient's desires, within the bounds of accepted treatment, and to protect the patient's confidentiality. Under this principle, the dentist's primary obligations include involving patients in treatment decisions in a meaningful way, with due consideration being given to

the patient's need, desires and abilities, and safeguarding the patient's privacy.^[3]

Non-maleficence("do no harm")

This principle expresses the concept that professionals have a duty to protect the patient from harm. Under this principle, the dentist's primary obligations include keeping updated knowledge and skills, knowing one's own limitations and when to refer to a specialist or other professional, and knowing when and under what circumstances delegation of patient care to auxiliaries is appropriate.^[3]

Beneficence("do good")

This principle expresses the concept that professionals have a duty to act for the benefit of others. Under this principle, the dentist's primary obligation is service to the patient and the public-at-large. The most important aspect of this obligation is the competent and timely delivery of dental care within the bounds of clinical circumstances presented by the patient, with due consideration being given to the needs, desires and values of the patient. The same ethical considerations apply whether the dentist engages in fee-for-service, managed care or some other practice arrangement. Dentists may choose to enter into contracts governing the provision of care to a group of patients; however, contract obligations do not excuse dentists from their ethical duty to put the patient's welfare first.^[4]


Justice (fairness)

This principle expresses the concept that professionals have a duty to be fair in their dealings with patients, colleagues and society. Under this principle, the dentist's primary obligations include dealing with people justly and delivering dental care

Ethics in prosthodontic research



Ethics originated from the greek term *ethikos* (ethos), denoting character or custom. Ethics are noble values that control the conduct of an individual or a society. It serves as an effective guide that advances the life and success. It is essential to follow in research to build a civilized society with right attitude, fair practices, and nonthreatening environment. It is not mandatory by rule but a moral requirement. It is unwritten code of conduct that encompasses both professional conduct and judgment. Although it varies from profession, the underlying principles remain the same.^[1]

A lack of ethical commitment will always result in academic, research, and moral failure. It is important to follow than drafting as rules and listing in literature. The adaptation of practice aids in building healthy environment and the benefits the entire social unit. In addition, it aids in obtaining the basic needs of achieving credibility to the group, uniting people, improving decision-making, prospective long-term gains, securing the society and more importantly protects the researchers.^[2-4]

Ethics can promote research, knowledge, and truth and minimize error. In addition, it promotes cooperation and coordination among people. It endorses trust, accountability, respect, fairness, and collaborative work. Most important in the ethical research is the accountability to the public or humans. The ethical norms in research also aid in obtaining community support for research. In recent years, extensive funds obtained are provided from public money that accounts for more accountability. Organizations are more likely to fund a research if it is reliable and qualitative.^[5-7]

Prosthodontics has undergone greater transitions in concepts, procedures, materials, technology, research, and evidence-based prosthodontics. The ethical concerns in prosthodontics are in two major zones – clinical prosthodontics and research. The clinical concerns involved widely from decision-making on treatment, standard of care to patients, and conflicts with noncooperative patients.^[8] The advances in prosthodontic research have

explored new avenues, but the majority of the data have lesser clinical applications. The end product users of research are the clinician and the benefits are for the patients. Most of the researches have lost its value when it had an unproductive clinical endpoint. Further, few researches lacked the concrete investigation, qualitative exploration, and demanded further analysis. This requests more realistic research questions, demanding methodology and analysis. Many of the studies oversight on the research protocol procedures which are essential to avoid conflict research design. The concerns in prosthodontic research range from recruitment procedures, methodology involved, publication and to clinical endpoint. It is optimum to follow the standard ethical procedures to avoid the divergence in research data.

The guidelines in prosthodontic research aid in education and monitor the conduct of the research. It involves majorly on protection to patients, research protocol followed, publication, funding, and declaration of conflicting interests. In clinical environment, the advice should include informed consent, respect of integrity, and patient autonomy.^[9] The research design should emphasis on honesty, objectivity, integrity, responsibility, confidentiality, protection of patients, and responsible conduct of research.^[9] It should also follow the standard statement guidelines of various research designs for better appreciation.

The report should not possess fabricated data, falsified information, plagiarism, statistical misuse, and other forms of research misconduct which are to be avoided. These can lead to erroneous growth of incorrect concepts and philosophies. The research standards encourage values such as obedience to law, community health, social accountability, human rights, animal care, and protection. Ethical lapses in research can significantly harm human and animal subjects, students, and the public. It is essential that the generalized guidelines in research to be followed. The WHO, Indian Council of Medical Research and International Committee of Medical Journal Editors have provided standard guidelines for research. The adaptation
