

Department of General Medicine, Santosh Medical College and Hospital in collaboration with Delhi Diabetic forum organized and conducted a Diabetes, Cardiovascular, Metabolic Diseases Awareness camp in the Department of general Medicine, Santosh Hospital Ghaziabad. Metabolic diseases are prevalent chronic non communicable diseases in the society and often go undiagnosed and untreated increasing the overall healthcare burden and contribute significantly to the cardiovascular morbidity and mortality. Non Communicable diseases need to be recognized in time which usually overlooked by the subject. Proper recognition and treatments of the aliments leads to increase in life expectancy of the person. During camp patient demographic features, BMI, weight, blood pressure waist hip ratios were estimated. Consultation, Random Blood Sugar testing, Glycosylated hemoglobin levels (HbA1C), Blood Pressure Measurement, Fundus Screening, BMI, lipid profile and ECG were done to estimate the cardiovascular risk in the population were done free of cost and more than 50 patients took benefit of the Health camp.

Apart from Screening and treating our camp was also focused on making the patient aware of their illness and how prompt lifestyle modifications and regular testing and medications can help control the entities.



Our honourable Vice Chancellor Dr Tripta Bhagat Madam presented a momento as a token of appreciation to honour Dr Shobhit Madan.















On International Survivors of Suicide Loss Day, those who have experienced suicide loss come together to share their stories in an effort to connect, understand, and find hope.

International Survivors of Suicide Loss Day was established in 1999 thanks to a resolution filed to the US Senate by Senator Harry Reid, who lost his father to suicide. The day, also known as Survivor Day, was set aside by the US Congress as a time for those who have been affected by suicide to get together for solace and support. Given that the holidays are frequently a tough time for suicide, it was decided that Survivor Day would always fall on the Saturday before the American Thanksgiving.

Suicide has a significant effect.

Serious emotional, physical, and financial effects result from suicide and suicide attempts. Suicide attempt survivors may sustain severe wounds that could have a long-term negative impact on their health. Additionally, they could struggle with depression and other mental health issues. The good news is that a majority of those who attempt suicide and survive never actually do so.

Friends, family, coworkers, and the community as a whole are affected by suicide and suicide attempts in terms of their health and wellbeing. When someone commits suicide, their surviving loved ones and friends may feel shocked, angry, guilty, depressive or anxious symptoms, or even suicidal thoughts.



India is home to 243 million adolescents – children aged 10 to 19 years – the most adolescents of any country. It accounts for about 21.3% of population of the country. These young children


come across different health problems varying from adolescent nutritional deficiencies to behavioral disorders, mental health problems, teen pregnancy and its related complications including unsafe abortion etc. A big challenge is that majority of these children and their parents are either unaware or ignorant of these problems. Hence as health care workers, we should create awareness in this target population. 


Report on Awareness on Sexual Harassment

She explained the contents of The Vishakha Judgement – 1997 wherein, the Supreme Court acknowledged that:

Sexual harassment is a human rights violation.

Sexual harassment is a violation of the constitutionally guaranteed fundamental rights:

Articles 14 and 15: Right to equality

Article 21: Right to life - to live with dignity

Article 19(1)(g) - Right to practice any profession/trade/occupation/business, i.e., a right to a safe environment free from harassment.

It is the Employer's duty to prevent and prohibit acts of sexual harassment and also redress and resolve grievances pertaining to sexual harassment.

Object of the Act is Prevention + Protection + Redressal.

The Act defines who is an employer, an employee and also what constitutes a workplace and an extended workplace. It defines what constitutes Sexual harassment under the new law and what circumstances are considered so.


It also explains who constitutes an Internal and Local Complaints Committee in case a complaint is lodged and what the Grievance Redressal Mechanism is for a victim. The act determines the interim reliefs as well as compensations to be granted to the victim along with penalties to be imposed on the accused and employers obligations during the entire process. She also critically analysed the act and explained its strengths and shortcomings as well.



Students from MBBS Batch 2019-2020 -Javith, Meenakshi and Riya and students from MBBS Batch 2020-21, Sameeksha, Ashish and Khushi were the student participants.
