Event Report:

Human Rights Day – 10th December 2022

Preface:

Santosh Deemed to be university (Ghaziabad) organised Human rights Day on 10th May 2022 at Department of Psychiatry on Saturday at 10:00 AM – 11:00 AM.

December 10 is recognized as International Human Rights Day. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which fought for the protection of fundamental rights for all people regardless of age, gender, or color, was approved on this day in 1948 by the United Nations General Assembly. The subject for this year, Human Rights, serves as a reminder that every day is Human Rights Day and that these rights are just one of the many principles and values that unite us as a world community.

What about those who experience mental health issues?

In a perfect world, everyone would be treated equally and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights would be the guiding principle, but sadly, many groups are still marginalized in modern society. Despite a special UN resolution that called for the protection, compassionate treatment, and respect of people with mental illness that was passed in the 1990s, people with mental health issues fell under this category. Recent studies actually demonstrate that those who struggle with mental health issues typically face stigma and discrimination as well as some of the greatest human rights abuses in the world.

Mental Health Care Act 2017

The Mental Health Care Act of 2017 (Act No. 10) An Act to Provide for Mental Healthcare and Services for Persons with Mental Illness, and to Protect, Promote, and Fulfill Such Persons' Rights During Delivery of Mental Healthcare and Services and for Matters Connected or Incidental Thereto.

1. The Mental Healthcare Act of 2017 intends to ensure that those who have attempted suicide are given options for rehabilitation from the government rather than being tried or punished for the attempt, thereby decriminalizing the act.
2. The Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities and its Optional Protocol require India to comply with certain international obligations, which the Act aims to do.
3. It is a change from the Mental Health Act of 1987 in that it seeks to empower those who are dealing with mental illness. The 2017 Act acknowledges the agency of those

who suffer from mental illness and grants them the right to make decisions about their health, provided they receive the necessary information.

4. The Act strives to protect the rights of those who suffer from mental illness, as well as their access to care and treatment without prejudice on the part of the government. Additionally, as is the case for the treatment of physical illnesses, insurers are also required to offer medical insurance coverage for the treatment of mental illness.
5. The Mental Health Care Act of 2017 has provisions for both the regulation of the industry and the registration of institutions involved in mental health. In order to prevent anyone with a mental disease from having to travel far for treatment, these measures include the requirement for the building of mental health facilities across the nation as well as the formation of a regulatory agency known as the mental health review board.
6. Electroconvulsive therapy (ECT) is only permitted under the terms of the Act in extreme circumstances, coupled with the use of anaesthetics and muscle relaxants. Additionally, it is now against the law to employ ECT as a treatment option for kids.
7. The 2017 Act outlines the obligations of various organizations, like the police, with regard to people with mental illness.
8. Additionally, the Mental Health Care Act of 2017 pledged to combat stigma surrounding mental illness and included some suggestions for doing so.

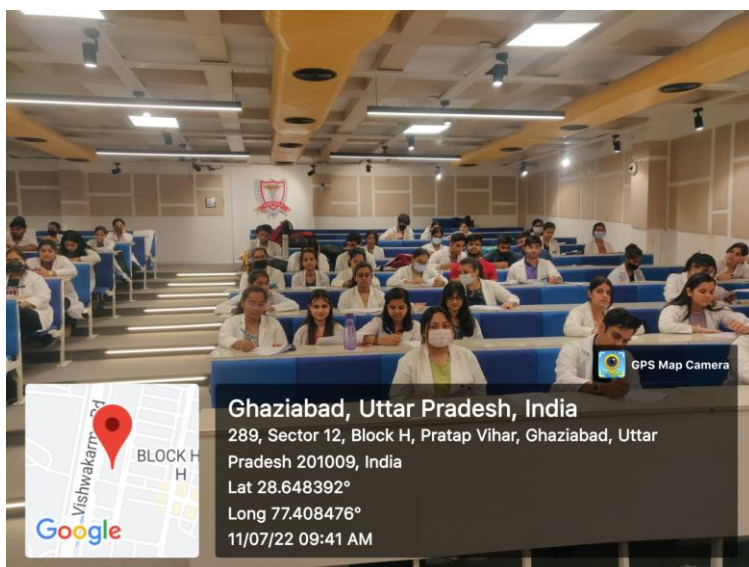
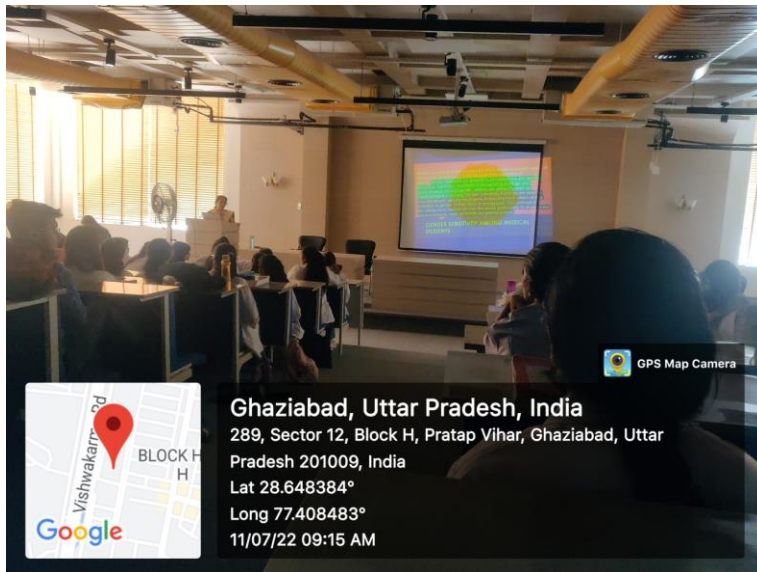






Department Of Biochemistry, Santosh Medical College & Hospital, Ghaziabad

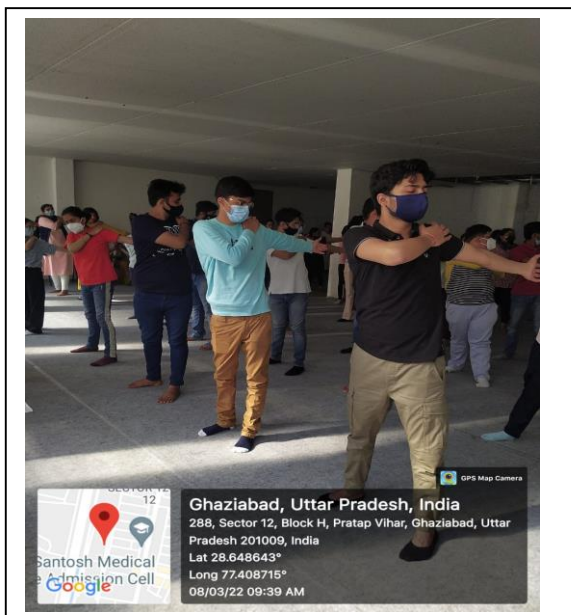


Santosh Deemed to be University An Initiative by IQAC

The Department of OBG also conducted a Public forum session in the foyer of the Santosh Hospital reception to create public awareness and prevention of common gynecological cancer



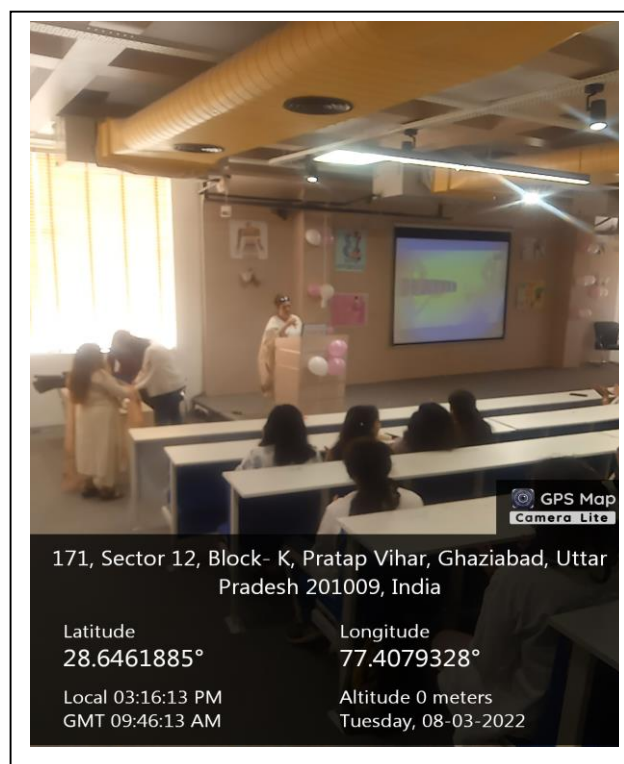

Rare Books & Digitalized Ancient Books

The Santosh Deemed to be University Central Library maintains rare books as well as digitalized books for users, ensuring that users have access to a diverse range of resources, including historical and cultural treasures, as well as modern digital resources.

Users have access to vast electronic resources through the National Digital Library Repository and World eBook collections related to traditional medicines and specialty resources. Additionally, the National Manuscript Mission and indianmanuscripts.com provide details on ancient books, including palm leaf manuscripts, Indian Rare Manuscripts (200 to 350 years old), antique books, historical ancient documents, and inscriptions.

The library has access to the South Asian archives and the World Digital Library through its Shodh Sindhu membership. These resources offer access to cultural treasures and significant historical documents, including books, manuscripts, maps, newspapers, journals, prints, photographs, sound recordings, and films.

The Rare Book Society of India is a virtual space for rare book collectors, showcasing rare Indian books, prints, and art that have been digitized. Members of RBSI can create a digital collection of rare and valuable books by downloading the digitized books that are made available.

The Library's web portal offers links to important resources related to ancient traditional medicines, including digital collections of ancient books, manuscripts, traditional manuscripts, discipline-specific learning resources from ancient Indian languages, special reports, and other knowledge resources for library enrichment, especially in reference to traditional systems of medicine.

Maintaining rare books requires specialized care and attention to ensure their preservation for future generations. Such books are often delicate and fragile, and require special handling and storage to prevent damage from environmental factors such as light, humidity, and temperature. The library staff must have the necessary skills and expertise to handle rare books with care.

Digitalized books, on the other hand, provide users with easy and convenient access to a vast range of resources. Digitalization helps to preserve books and manuscripts that are fragile, rare, or otherwise difficult to access. Digital resources can also be easily accessed

from remote locations, allowing users to access the library's resources from anywhere in the world. Additionally, digitalization helps to reduce the wear and tear on physical books, extending their lifespan and preserving them for future generations.

By maintaining both rare and digitalized books, the Santosh Deemed to be University Central Library is ensuring that its users have access to a rich and diverse range of resources, while also preserving important cultural and historical treasures for future generations.

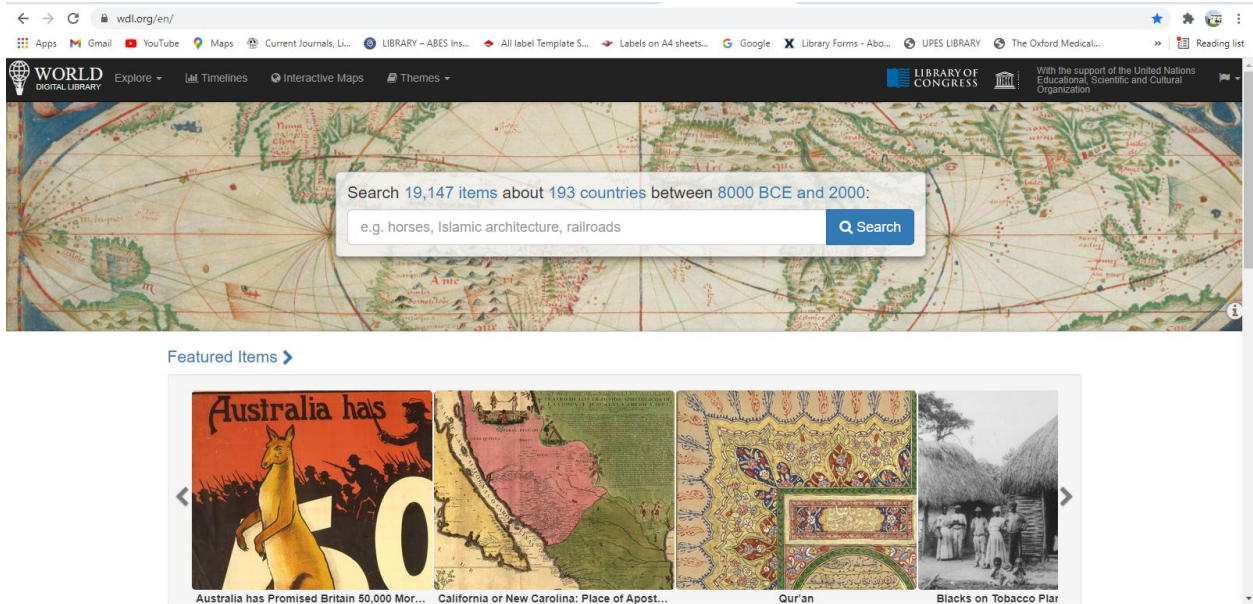

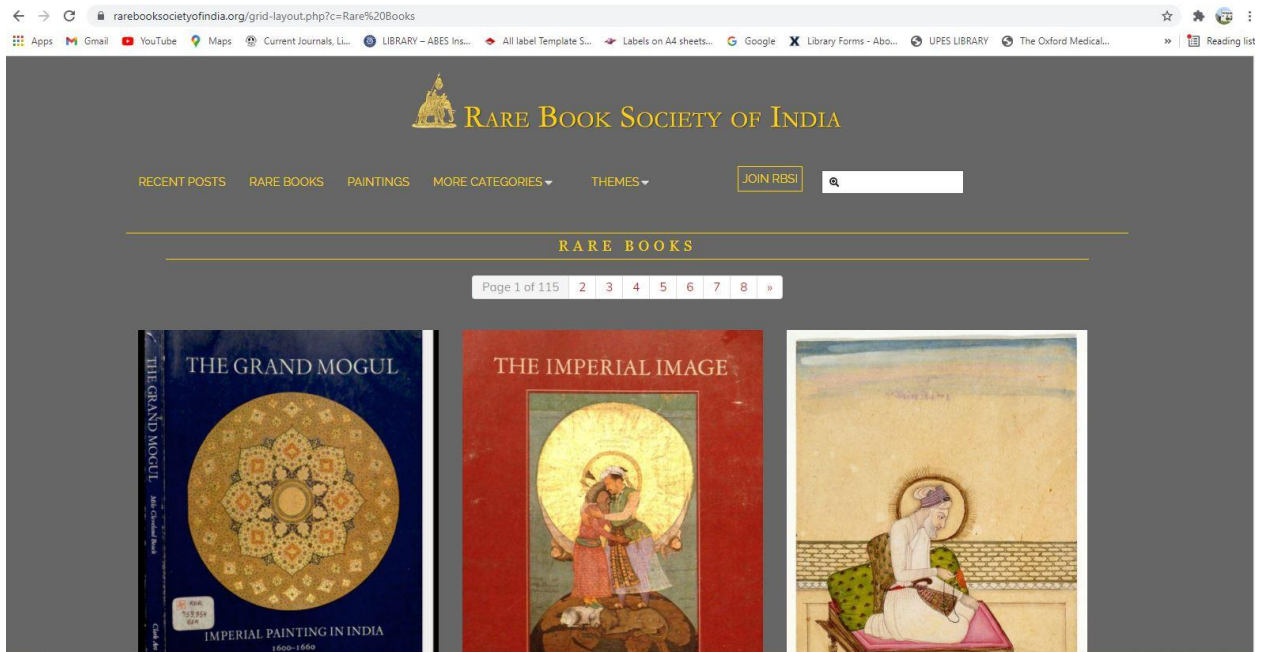

Book Bank Policy

The Book Bank Policy of the Central Library of Santosh Deemed to be University is a scheme that enables needy students from weaker sections, physically challenged students, and other deserving students to get one set of basic text books from the library each semester. The following are the procedures that students need to follow to avail of the Book Bank facility:

- The Book Bank facility is semester-based, and books will be issued accordingly.
- The Book Bank books are issued in addition to the regular library books.
- Students who opt for the Book Bank scheme will receive one set of text books at the beginning of the semester.
- The recommended and suggested text books are chosen by the subject experts.
- Only one prescribed text book will be issued per subject.
- Books will be issued on a first come, first serve basis, depending upon their availability.
- At the end of the semester, the books must be returned, and students will be allowed to borrow the next semester's books.
- If any student loses, damages, or defaces the book, he or she must replace the book with a new one or pay the current cost of the book as per the Library Rules.
- To avail of the Book Bank facility, students must fill out a request form available at the Central Library Circulation Desk.
- By following these procedures, students can make the most of the Book Bank facility and access the necessary learning resources to achieve academic success.

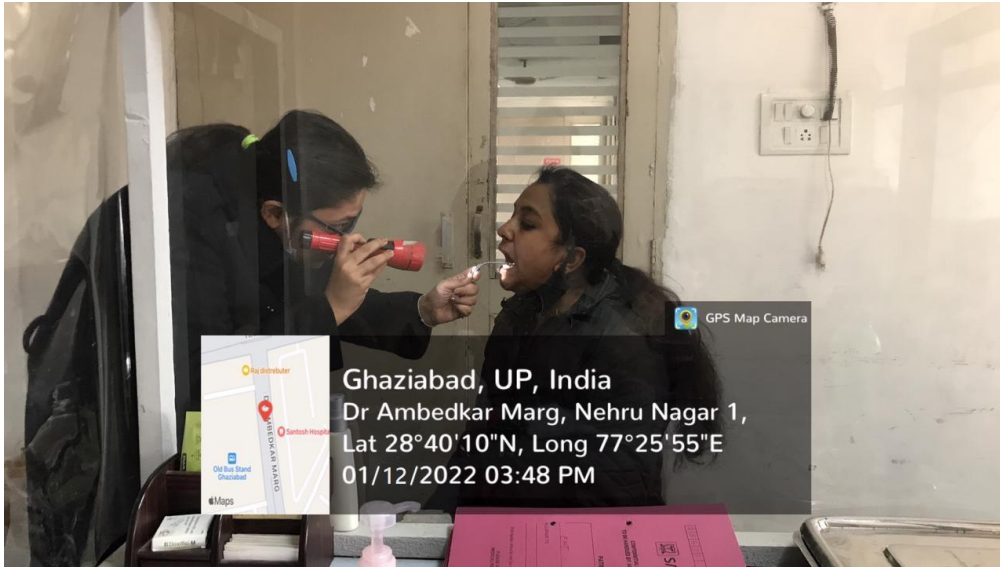
NATIONAL YOUTH DAY
